Apr 3, 1–4 pm BIRD ANATOMY FOR ARTISTS

From goldfinches to bald eagles, Bartram's Garden is a favorite stop for many migratory and year-round species of birds. In this one-of-a-kind workshop, we'll take a look at the art and the science of avian anatomy. Explore new techniques for drawing on the fly and experience our feathered friends from a new perspective.

Work *en plein air* in the medium of your choice to capture light and shadow, and to create a convincing sense of space and form, including a variety of trees, flowers and buildings. Drawing and painting techniques will be demonstrated for oil and gouache. Offered in collaboration with the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts. This is a six-part short course that meets over 6 Sundays from 4/17 to 5/22. The fee includes all six classes.

Apr 17, 3:30–5 pm FAMILY WORKSHOP: RIVER LANDSCAPES \$12 | free

Teaching artist Heather Rinehart welcomes artists of all ages aboard Mary Mattingly's Wetland houseboat to learn the basics of landscape painting on the water. Be sure to take advantage of this unusual opportunity to create beautiful Schuylkill landscape paintings from a unique perspective! Life jackets, safety instruction, and transportation from the dock to the boat will be provided by Bartram's Riverfront staff. Ages 5+.

May 1, 1–3 pm NATURE PRINTING \$18 | free

Nature printing was practiced by 18th- and 19th-century botanists, from Joseph Breintnall to Anna Atkins, as an efficient method of recording plant specimens. Much of it was created in the Philadelphia area, particularly at Bartram's Garden. Create handsome nature prints of your own using a variety of simple techniques.

May 22, 1–4 pm PATTERNS IN NATURE

Art is all around us. In this workshop, we'll explore the many naturally occurring patterns in the garden, and experiment with ways to use them in our art. Materials will be provided, and you will leave with a work of art you've created yourself.

## Jun 12, 1–4 pm ILLUSTRATING BARTRAM TREES

From the stately Yellowwood to North America's oldest Ginkgo biloba, Bartram's Garden plays host to a diverse array of trees. In this workshop, we'll explore the garden and learn to render key elements of many different species of tree, from bark to crown. Step by step instruction and materials will be provided.
